REPORT ON WORLD HAND HYGIENE DAY 2025 OBSERVANCE

The Hospital Infection Control Unit (HICU), in collaboration with the Nursing Service Division, observed **World Hand Hygiene Week 2025** from **1st to 5th May**. This annual initiative was held in alignment with the **World Health Organization's (WHO) global campaign** – *SAVE LIVES: Clean Your Hands*, which advocates for effective hand hygiene as a vital practice in healthcare settings to prevent healthcare-associated infections and ensure patient safety.

This year's theme, "It might be gloves – it's always hand hygiene," served as a powerful reminder that wearing gloves does not replace the need for proper hand hygiene. The campaign emphasized that hand hygiene must be performed at the right time and in the correct manner, whether gloves are used or not, to protect both patients and healthcare professionals.

Highlights of the Week

1. One-Day Workshop on Infection Prevention and Care Bundle Practices

The week began with a comprehensive one-day workshop conducted on 1st May 2025 at Auditorium 2, from 8:00 AM to 4:00 PM. All nursing officers participated in the sessions, which were designed to enhance awareness and practical knowledge of infection prevention.

The workshop featured a series of expert-led presentations: **Peripheral Intravenous Cannulation – Best Practices, Complications & Infection Management** by *Mr. Ajesh M.J.*, Area Manager, Becton Dickinson. **Central Line Care & Maintenance** by *Mr. Babuji K.*, Branch Manager, Becton Dickinson. **Ventilator-Associated Pneumonia (VAP)** by *Dr. Lakshmi Natarajan*, PDCC – Hospital Infection Control. And **Catheter-Associated Urinary Tract Infection (CAUTI) – Care Bundle** by *Dr. Shilpa Mohan*, PDCC – Hospital Infection Control. Participants also engaged in **hands-on skill stations**: *Peripheral Intravenous Cannulation and central line insertion and maintenance* - led by *Mr. Ajesh amd Mr.Babuji. Female urinary catheter insertion and maintenance* – led by *Mr. Kiran S. Kumar*, Nursing Officer-B, Cardiology ICU.

2. Infection Control Assessment – NABH Focus

On **2nd May**, a structured assessment was carried out to evaluate infection control practices across various departments, with a focus on compliance with NABH standards. This initiative aimed to foster healthy competition and recognize outstanding performance.
